Roedean Moira House is a leading independent day and boarding School for girls aged 0 to 18 years. Founded by Mr Charles Ingham in Surrey in 1875, and moving to Eastbourne in 1887, Moira House is an inter-denominational School that welcomes girls of all faiths into the community.

The School's ethos and Christian principles provide the framework for a holistic education that encourages all our students to be the best that they can be. Our founder, Charles Ingham, was a pioneer in female education in Victorian England, and his legacy continues in our school today with Moira House continuing to drive forward the ambition and aspiration of the girls in our care.
