Camera Use Policy

1 Aims

This guidance applies to the collection and use of images of any person who can be identified, whether they are a pupil, teacher, other employee, governor, visitor or parent and aims to promote safe and sensible use of cameras within the school by pupils, staff, parents and visitors.

For the purposes of this guidance, an image is a still or moving picture of a person who can be identified.

2 Introduction

- 2.1 Photographs and video for school and family use are a source of innocent pleasure and pride, which can enhance the self-esteem of children and young people and their families. Parents/carers are not required to comply with the Data Protection Act 1998 when taking photographs for their own private use of their children at an organised event.
- 2.2 Parents should not be stopped taking photographs for their own private use because of concerns of contravening the Data Protection Act. However we must always be mindful of the need to safeguard the welfare of children in our school, and issues of child protection, data protection and parental consent will be given careful thought. Images may be used to harm

children, for example as a preliminary to 'grooming' or by displaying them inappropriately on the Internet.

- 2.3 This policy will apply to all forms of publications; print, film, video, DVD, on websites and in the professional media.
- 2.4 Where another body provides services or activities separately, using the school premises, the School Council will ensure that the body concerned has appropriate policies and procedures in place in regard to safeguarding children.
- 2.5 For further guidance to staff, volunteers, governors and council members please see the School's Data Protection and Acceptable ICT use policy.

3 Consent forms

- 3.1 All parents of pupils in the school are asked to sign a consent form to give permission to publish photographs in public places (including websites).
- 3.2 If parents/ carers disagree over consent for their child, it will be treated as if consent has not been given.

4 Use of images

Parents and carers

- 4.1 The school will decide if the event is one at which photography and videoing will be permitted.
- 4.2 Only images of children suitably dressed will be allowed to reduce the risk of images being used inappropriately. Special consideration will be given to photographs taken during PE (sports day) and swimming.
- 4.3 Those parents and carers in the school to help with assisting children to dress or change will not be allowed to take photos or videos during this time.

Schools

4.4 If a photograph is likely to be used again it will be stored securely and only accessed by those people authorised to do so.

5 Children who should not be identified

5.1 Every effort will be made by the school to prevent capturing of the image of any child who should not be identified.

6 Media photographing and filming

- 6.1 The media operate under their own Code of Practice. Photographs taken by the media are usually exempt from the Data Protection Act.
- 6.2 If the media are invited into school for publicity purposes parents/carers of those children likely to appear will be informed.

7 Video conferencing

7.1 Where parents have asked that their children's images should not be included in video conference every effort will be made to avoid this.

8 Mobile phones (MMS Multi-media messaging service, video phones)

8.1 These phones can take and transmit images and the same rules apply as for other photography, the user needs to recognise that any pictures taken are for personal use only.

9 CCTV (where installed)

9.1 Our CCTV will be operated in accordance with the principles of data protection.

10 Guidance for parents

10.1 People with no connection to our school will not be allowed to photograph – staff will question anyone they do not recognise who is using a camera and or video recorder at events and productions.

Appendix 1

'Use your camera and video courteously'

A guide for parents who wish to use photography and/or video a school event

Generally photographs and videos for school and family use are a source of innocent pleasure and pride, which can make children, young people and their families feel good about themselves. By following some simple guidelines we can proceed safely and with regard to the law.

Remember that parents/carers and others, attend school events at the invitation of the Head and School Council.

The Head and School have the responsibility to decide if photography and videoing of school performances is permitted

The Head and School Council have the responsibility to decide the conditions that will apply so that children are kept safe and that the performance is not disrupted and children and staff not distracted.

Parents and carers can use photographs and videos taken at a school event for their own personal use only. Such photos and videos must not be sold and must not be put on the web/internet. To do so would likely break Data Protection legislation.

Recording or/photographing other than for your own private use would require the consent of all the other parents whose children may be included in the images.

Parents and carers must follow guidance from staff as to when photography and videoing is permitted and where to stand in order to minimise disruption to the activity.

Parents and carers must not photograph or video children changing for performances or events

If you are accompanied or represented by people that school staff do not recognise they may need to check who they are, if they are using a camera or video recorder.

Remember that for images taken on mobiles phones the same rules apply as for other photography, you should recognise that any pictures taken are for personal use only.
